The Directorate of Handicrafts & Cottage Industries is looking after promotion and development of handicrafts industries in the State. The following state level organizations are now functioning under the administrative control of this Directorate to facilitate the development of handicraft sector.

### Handicrafts sector of Odisha

Odisha is considered as land of handicrafts which is an integral part of our cultural heritage. As many as 50 different crafts are practiced by about 1.30 lakh artisans in varied degrees and dispersed through-out the state. The State has got best craftsmanship in the country having highest number of artisans honoured with National Awards including Padma Awards.

The handicraft sector has been recognized as a potential sector for providing self employment both in rural & urban areas with less capital investment, use of simple technology and having ample scope for marketing with value addition.

## 1. State Plan

### 1.1 Promotion of Handicraft Industries

#### (a) Institutional Training

The departmental training centres established at state and district level play an important role in creating new generation craft persons with adequate skill transfer and exposure. Following training courses are conducted at state & district level in departmental training centers.

#### State Level Training Centre

(a) This centre is running in Handicrafts Complex and managed by SIDAC. During the year 2015-16, 130 candidates have completed training and 140 candidates are undergoing training in various crafts as per the details below.

### (c) MCM Training Programme

The scheme is reintroduced during the current year to impart training to artisan in different crafts by engaging reputed master craft persons in order to increase the handicraft artisans of the state as this sector provides the best opportunity for self employment with minimum capital investment. The trainees take up business activities with bank linkage or own finance after completion of the training.

During 2015-16, training has been imparted to 825 artisans under MCM as detailed below:

Marketing assistance is provided to Cooperatives/ SHGs/ individual artisans through exhibitions organized inside and outside the state. Assistance is also provided for participation in GIFT Fair/ Organization of Buyer-Seller Meet/Fairs/Exhibitions being organized by other agencies.

During 2015-16, 2380 handicraft artisans have participated in different exhibitions organized at the district level, state level and outside the state exhibitions and sales turnover was around Rs.1740.98 lakh.

Skill up-gradation training provided to all the artisans along-with distribution of tools & equipments. There is a provision of margin money assistance @ Rs.900 per artisan being paid to SHGs for bank linkage.

### 1.3 Rehabilitation of Handicrafts artisans:

Under the scheme Financial assistance up to Rs.10,000/- is provided as margin money for availing bank finance up to Rs.50,000/- for setting up own production unit. During the year 2015-16, there is a budget provision of Rs.70.00 lakhs to rehabilitate 800 handicraft artisans with margin money support to avail bank finance in order to establish own production units. #### 1.4 Modernisation & Technological Up-gradation of Handicraft Industries:

Under the scheme Financial assistance up to Rs.12.00 lakhs is provided as back-ended subsidy for availing bank loan for projects up to Rs.50.00 lakhs for modernization of handicraft enterprises. During the year 2015-16, there is a budget provision of Rs.90.00 lakhs to establish 60 handicraft enterprises. #### 1.5. Construction of Workshed -cum-Housing for Handicraft Artisans:

The scheme “Construction of Workshed-cum-Housing for Handicraft Artisans” was introduced during 2013-14 to provide workshed-cum-housing and hygienic environment with well ventilated and naturally lighted working space to artisan families in order to improve productivity. The uniform unit cost of construction of work shed-cum-housing under the scheme is Rs.70,000/-. But, in case of hilly / difficult areas, additional cost of Rs.5,000/- may be provided. The total construction area is 180 Sq. Ft. There will be no participatory contribution from the beneficiaries.
